Quick recap

The meeting covered a range of administrative and organizational matters for a swimming-related group, including elections, bylaw changes, and policy updates. Discussions were held on strategic planning, athlete funding, and operational issues such as meet hosting and official requirements. The conversation ended with the approval of various amendments and the announcement of election results for several key positions within the organization.

Next steps

- Sanction Committee: Make urgent decision regarding the hosting of 12 & under Long Course Championship meet, as UNO pool is unavailable
- Executive Committee: Review potential solutions for hosting the 12 & under Championship meet, including combining with 13 & over meet or finding alternative host team
- Miranda: Confirm Fremont pool availability for July 26th weekend for potential 12 & under Championship meet
- Governance Committee: Review and revise the policy regarding team officials' requirements and recruitment, addressing concerns about fairness to small teams and compliance with USA Swimming rules
- Governance Committee: Define clear criteria for "attached" and "unattached" membership status in policy documents
- Finance Committee: Consider including championship meet awards funding in future budgets
- Executive Committee: Review potential budget allocation for Midwestern Swimming to cover awards costs for championship meets
- Steve Marchitelli: Forward USA Swimming female coach governance program application information to interested coaches before May 15th deadline
- Steve: Update policy documents to reflect the correct club membership fees
- Steve: Update policy documents to change "Times Chair" references to "Secretary" for consistency
- Governance Committee: Consider bylaw changes to stagger Administrative Review Board terms to avoid simultaneous turnover
- Betty: Continue managing out-of-LSC meet times and database updates for Midwestern records and Top Times

Summary

Addressing Technical Issues and Voting

The meeting began with participants joining both in-person and online, causing some initial issues. Stefanie Martinez asked everyone to turn on their cameras so voting members could be seen. The group confirmed that a quorum was present, with 29 participants on Zoom. Stefanie worked to identify all online participants and ensure everyone can hear properly, addressing some technical issues with people joining twice.

Athlete Election, Minutes, and Consent Agenda

Stefanie Martinez discussed the outcome of the athlete representative election, which was won by Charlotte Schrum as the only candidate due to age/grade issue with second candidate. Stefanie also mentioned the approval of the November 17th and March 2nd meeting minutes. The consent agenda, including the office report and financial reports, was approved without any opposition.

Athlete Funding for Central Zone Summit

The meeting then focused on the request for athlete funding for the Central Zone athlete summit, with two athletes showing interest. Stefanie proposed reallocating funds to support the athletes' attendance at the summit, which was approved by the board.

Strategic Plan

The Strategic Planning Committee (Jack French presenting) presented a strategic plan Power Point for 2025-2027 with five priorities: athlete growth and retention, high performance athlete development, coaching education and development, meet operations and competitive experience, and governance, organizational structure and digital presence. The plan includes specific tasks assigned to individuals in leadership roles. The HOD approved the strategic plan with the understanding that dates and individual assignments are flexible. Motion to approve – Jack French; Seconded – Docker Hartfield. Passed.

Board of Directors Manual

The Governance Committee presented updates to the Board manual, including revised job descriptions for several positions and a proposed new media coordinator role. Some positions have been changed from chair to coordinator to align with USA Swimming Bylaws. The media coordinator position was discussed as potentially overwhelming and may require a committee or funding in the future.

Bylaws Review and Proposed Changes

Stefanie Martinez reviewed proposed changes to the organization's bylaws. In Article 4, positions are changed from "chair" to "coordinator," and a requirement for visible participation in virtual meetings is added. Article 5 removes the Executive Secretary as an ex officio member and updates communication methods. Article 6 discusses changes to officer positions, including a debate about keeping the secretary position. Article 7 proposes that the general chair cannot hold office for two years after their term expires and adds mentorship responsibilities for the senior vice chair to support the Athlete Rep Committee.

Approval of Proposed Bylaws Changes

The meeting focused on discussing and voting on changes to the organization's bylaws and policies. The Governance Committee proposed several amendments, including adding the Secretary back as an officer and modifying the Operational Risk Committee. The changes were approved with a majority vote. The meeting also discussed the removal of Woodbury County from the geographic territory, for which approval from USA Swimming has not been received. The updated bylaws and policies were approved, and the conversation ended with a discussion on the next steps. Motion made to amend to include Secretary as an officer – Leslie Mayo, Seconded – Betsy Purcell. Passed. Motion to approve as amended David Nelson; Seconded Paige Skidmore. Passed

MW Policies and Procedures

The meeting focused on discussing and clarifying various policies and procedures related to club board members, voting rights, and the use of credit cards. The attendees discussed the need to define what it means to be attached to a team and how this affects voting rights. They also discussed changes to the reimbursement for officials, the use of credit cards, and the Annual Performance Review. The meeting also touched on swim meet policies, including the addition of the technical planning chair to the sanctioning committee and changes to the dates for team meets and Central Zones. The attendees agreed to work on defining what it means to be attached to a team and to clarify the process for initial splits in swim meets.

Stefanie Martinez discussed the proposed policy regarding the process of entering a meet with more than 10 swimmers, which would require a team to supply one official for every 10 swimmers. The team must also provide additional officials based on the number of swimmers. If a team fails to meet this requirement, they will not be allowed to enter the meet and will be fined \$100. The team's swimmers would not be allowed to participate in the meet. The meeting also touched on the issue of recruiting officials, with suggestions for a more strategic approach rather than a punitive one. The team also discussed the process of awarding swimmer awards, with a focus on the age groups and the need for a Times chair. The conversation ended with a discussion on the increase in club membership fees – (\$405.00 for renewing clubs and \$930 for new clubs), which was voted on by the House of Delegates.

The Policies and Procedures changes will go back to the Board of Directors for approval.

Noted: Nominations for Women in Governance for USA Swimming due by May 15. Those with nominations should contact Steve Marchitelli.

Elections Process and Administrative Review Board

In the meeting, Stefanie Martinez led the discussion on the elections process. Discussed was the eligibility of individuals, including Tony Vendetti (not currently in good standing), and Adam Ogura removing his name from the Delegate at Large slate. Stefanie also explained the roles and requirements of the

Administrative Review Board, emphasizing the need for a minimum of five non-athlete members and two athlete members. Votes were taken both online and in person via electronic voting for one office at a time. The process ended with the announcement of the election results for various positions, including the Age Group Chair – Tara Goss, Treasurer – Toby Rees, At Large Position – Georgia Androy, Technical Planning Chair – David Edwards, Operational Risk Chair – Adam Ogura, and Officials Chair – Dan Brailita. The Administrative Review Board was also discussed, with a decision made to add a sixth member to the board. Members will be Bill Haney, Kim Berndt, Kim Schmidt, Miranda Long, Brian Adam, Docker Hartfield, Theo Steiner (athlete) and Carter Brady (athlete)

UNO Pool Unavailability Meet Discussion

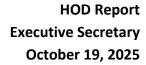
The meeting discussed the hosting of the 12 and under long course championship meet. Jimmy and Jeff can no longer host the meet at UNO as planned due to pool unavailability. Various options are considered, including combining it with the 13 and over meet, hosting it at Fremont, or having Midwestern Swimming host it directly. Concerns are raised about equipment availability, staffing, and timeline implications. The group agrees to continue discussions, possibly involving the Sanction Committee or Executive Committee, to find a solution soon.

Also mentioned – request for MW to help teams host meets (Docker); consider paying for awards and hospitality. Noted not part of budget.

Sanctions/Meet Schedules-

MW 2025-2025 Short Course – The sanction committee has met and most of the fall meet requests have been approved and are posted. The sanction committee has had several meetings. Winter meets are listed. MW has several bids for short course championship meets, but not for the dates the committee prefers – weekend before State HS for Age Group and weekend after State HS for Senior. Committee will meet and chose sites and meet formats soon.

MW 2026 Long Course – At this point no requests for meets for 2026 Long Course/Summer have been submitted, and championship meet dates have not been set. Zone 14 & Under meet is August 6-9, 2026.

- Zone Meet In 2026 the 14 & U Zone meet for Midwestern will be held August 6-9, 2026 in Minneapolis MN. Most likely it will be a full 4-day meet. In 2027 CZ will host THREE meets with bid sites being West Fargo ND, Pleasant Prairie WI, Holland MI. In 2028 CZ 14 & U meets may be divided by geography. In 2025 both CZ 14 and Under meets had more athletes than anticipated, but both sites were able to accommodate. Central Zone has several committees working on meet format and their policies and procedures.
- All Star Meet The 2026 All Star meet is scheduled for January 9-11 in Des Moines IA. There will probably be some changes made to the meet format for 2026. MW will be selecting its team based on the following: Athletes scored Top 10 in each All Star contested event based on times since September 1, 2025, times achieved prior to December 15, 2025, 12 athletes per gender and age group, 72 total athletes. Format for selection has been distributed to coaches. Head coach ballots have been distributed as well as an application form for assistant coaches.
- Athlete, Outreach, Officials Reimbursements Athlete reimbursement requested for national meets since September 1, 2024 is \$14,400 (Juniors, Nationals, Sectionals, CZ Open Water, Futures). Reimbursements for 2024-2025 are now closed. \$470.63 has been sent for Outreach reimbursement for the same period. GoogleForms for both Athlete Reimbursement and Outreach Reimbursement are posted and distributed to clubs. Officials' reimbursement for those officiating at national level meets was \$900.00 since September 1, 2024. (Financial reports may not show the same numbers as those number are based on fiscal year and timing of accounting.)
- Awards Awards for 2025 will be distributed at the Awards Ceremony following the HOD meeting.
- USAS Summit and ABM MW had 7 persons attending the Summit and ABM in Denver Sept 25-27. Those attending were
 Stefanie Martinez, David Nelson, Leslie Mayo, Jimmy Parmenter, Greta Olberding, Olivia French, and Betty Kooy. Reports
 from attendees are included in the Consent Agenda. Changes to rules and regulations can be found on the USA Swimming
 website 2025 Legislative Actions.
- High School Swimming The lowa girls HS season is coming to an end and boys season will soon start. The Nebraska HS season will start on November 17, 2025 and conclude on February 28, 2026. In past several HS 'Invitationals' have been 'observed' and times for USA Swimming members have been used for USA purposes. In 2025-2026 a total of 16 meets were observed. Again, requests for observations are being considered from HS Invites providing the meets have the required staff and are run with a meet management program that is editable by the MW Office to make sure the appropriate information is in the database (correct name, correct birthdate, USAS ID# and team as UN-MW rather than the HS team). Applications have been sent to those who hosted HS observed meets last year.

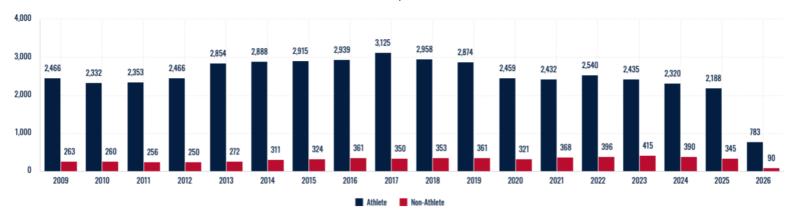

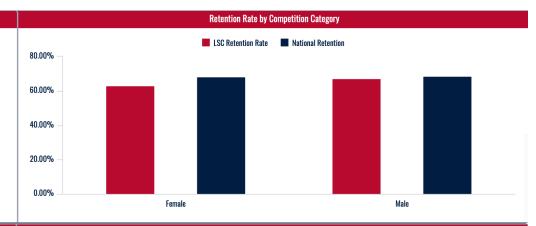

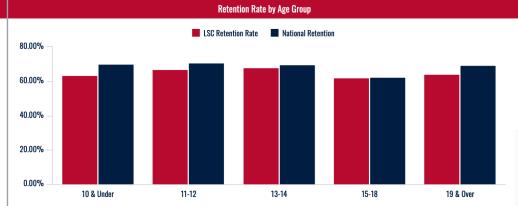
LSC Retention Rate vs National Average by Season



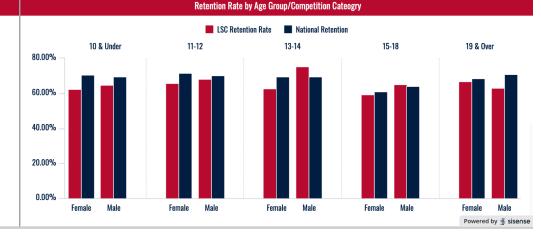

USA Summit Report

During the USA Swimming Summit, we discussed several key topics relevant to our LSC's operations and growth. One major topic was the sanctioning *process*, including how other LSCs are managing both general sanctions. The use of AI was brought up to use with looking at meet flyers to make sure they are being used correctly and how AI can help with this to catch errors and adjust corrections. We also reviewed *championship meet fees* and shared strategies for addressing the *rising costs of facility rentals*, which are impacting many LSCs nationwide.

Another important discussion centered on *growing and promoting our sport*, especially as participation numbers decline and swimming competes with other youth sports for athletes. A *coaches' panel* provided valuable insight into challenges with *facility access, coach-owned vs. board-owned teams*, merging clubs and effective collaboration models.

We also attended an *informative session on the Coaches Advisory Council*, learning about its role as a *liaison between coaches and USA Swimming*. The council provides valuable feedback to the *Board of Directors* and serves as a channel for coaches to share ideas, raise concerns, and stay involved in the direction of the sport.

Additionally, we gained a better understanding of *government and regulatory procedures within USA Swimming* and had productive discussions on what our LSC can do to improve its operations and better support clubs, coaches, and athletes.

USA Swimming 2025 Annual Business Meeting – Key Notes

Location & Dates:

September 24–27, 2025 • Denver, Colorado

Held in conjunction with the **USA Swimming Annual Summit**, the Annual Business Meeting featured updates on governance, development, and administrative priorities for the sport.

Key Takeaways

Rule Changes

- The House of Delegates voted on proposed amendments to the 2025 Rules & Regulations.
- Updates included the recognition of new events for 15–18-year-old swimmers, following the addition of the 50-meter stroke events (butterfly, backstroke, breaststroke) to the **Los Angeles 2028 Olympic Games** schedule.

LSC Boundary Changes

- Multiple proposals to modify Local Swimming Committee (LSC) boundaries were voted down.
- As a result, ongoing territorial and jurisdictional issues remain unresolved.

Officiating Flexibility

- A proposal aimed at increasing flexibility in official requirements for meet results eligible for the SWIMS database was **not approved**.
- This proposal was linked to the growing **Block Party** program and addressed challenges in recruiting and certifying officials.

Block Party Program Expansion

- **Phase Three** of the Block Party pilot program launched in September 2025.
- The expansion opens participation to approximately **25% of USA Swimming clubs** (~700 programs nationwide).
- New President & CEO Kevin M. Ring expressed strong support for the initiative and a desire to see more meets of this type.

Leadership Update

• **Kevin M. Ring** was officially appointed as **President and CEO** of USA Swimming and the USA Swimming Foundation, effective **September 17, 2025**.

Budget & Financials

• The 2025 budget projects a **balanced financial plan** with \$39.7 million in revenue and \$39.6 million in operating expenses, according to *SwimSwam*.

Annual Summit Tracks & Sessions

The Annual Summit provided targeted development sessions for various roles within the swimming community:

Athlete Track

• Topics: Athlete representation, Safe Sport, DEI/DICE, and presenting new initiatives.

Coach Track

• Focus: "Embracing Chaos" in coaching, coach—general chair collaboration, and skill development blueprints.

General Chair Track

• Covered: LSC disputes, purposeful funding strategies, and using data for informed decision-making.

Officials Track

• Emphasis: Mentorship, official evaluation, and managing difficult conversations.

Safe Sport Track

• Topics: SSRP implementation, cultivating a positive team culture, and compliance with Safe Sport policies.

Registrar Track

• Covered: Registration and membership management, LSC reporting, times reconciliation, results submission, and certification requirements.

Report on USA Swimming National Summit

Submitted by: Adam Ogura, Official Representative

Overview:

I had the privilege of attending the USA Swimming National Summit as the official representative for our LSC. My participation focused on the Safe Sport sessions and the Officials' Track, both of which provided valuable insights and actionable strategies to enhance our local swimming community.

Safe Sport Sessions:

The Safe Sport portion began with a presentation by Detective Mark Enomoto of the Colorado Springs ICAC (Internet Crimes Against Children) unit. Detective Enomoto outlined the various ways children are exploited online through apps, games, and websites. He emphasized the importance of partnerships with organizations such as the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC) and highlighted resources available to families, including:

- The CyberTipline for reporting concerns: https://report.cybertip.org/
- The Take It Down service for removing explicit images: https://takeitdown.ncmec.org/
- Monitoring apps for parents to track online activity

The second session featured Nikken Patten, a forensic investigator with the Colorado Springs Police Department. She provided important context on victim behavior, noting that children may not always display visible signs of distress or trauma and may even attempt to protect their abuser, especially when the abuser is a trusted individual such as a coach or mentor. Ms. Patten reassured attendees that, even if no immediate action is visible after a report is made, reporters should feel confident that they have taken the correct steps to protect children.

Officials' Track:

The Officials' Track was comprehensive, with additional sessions on Thursday and a full agenda on Friday. The focus was on the development and support of N2 mentors (evaluators) and enhancing the overall experience for both mentors and the officials they evaluate. Key topics included:

- Criteria and selection process for N2 mentors, including certification requirements and recent meet participation
- Best practices for preparing to evaluate at meets, including verifying officials' qualifications in advance
- Understanding different learning styles and effective communication strategies
- Approaches to handling challenging conversations
- Growth and expectations for N3 mentors, as outlined by the National Officials Committee

Next Steps:

I have collected all relevant presentations and extensive notes, which I have already shared with Dan Brailita. I look forward to disseminating this information to our officials in the LSC and implementing best practices to strengthen our officiating program.

Acknowledgments:

Immediately following the keynote session, join us for an important conversation as USA Swimming's new Chief Executive Officer, Kevin Ring, takes the stage with Olympic gold medalist Cullen Jones. This "fireside chat" will be an opportunity to hear directly from Kevin, learn more about his background and vision, and gain insight into his priorities as he begins his tenure leading USA Swimming.

Friday:

Navigating LSC disputes- see attachment

Presentation began with asking the group how confident they were where disputes should be sent. At end of presentation, almost all participants had admitted they were mistaken about where most of the problems should have been referred. In speaking with many smaller LSC's, they do not have an Administrative Review Board, so that they can utilize the volunteers in other board positions (volunteers are scare and if on ARB, cannot hold a board position). This also frees up athlete volunteers and puts them on committees that meet more often and have more involvement. Finally, they argued that all disputes go to the National board, so the ARB was not necessary since USA swimming could handle them.

Fees with purpose-funding that matters

There was little to learn in this presentation other than an awareness that each LSC handles fees differently. There is no magic formula, but the overarching goal has to be that fees should be in alignment with the LSC's goal to promote and assist athletes.

Coaches and general chairs collaborate for growth

This presentation was an information gathering activity for LSC's to identify what the number one issue that the LSC needed to address in a variety of subject matters. It was a good opportunity to meet other LSC members, but did not offer a lot of ideas.

Diving into Data: SWIMS insight for smarter LSC decisions

We were given examples of the data that can be generated from SWIMS. There are staff within USA swimming that can assist us in generating specific data to inform our decision makers on specific subject areas. For example, data trends on what clubs are retaining more swimmers.

We are supposed to be sent the powerpoint presentations for all of the above. When I receive that, I can forward on to anyone who is interested.

- Derek, USA Swimming Staff- A member of a club steals from their club (usually a treasurer or staff member), the team has filed a police report. Where should the team also report the complaint?
- 2. Paul, LSC/Zone Safe Sport- During an LSC committee meeting, the chair complains that athlete members are mandated to serve on the committee and criticizes their lack of knowledge and inability to provide relevant input. Following the meeting, other members wanted to report the committee chair for potentially abusive behavior toward the athletes. Where should this complaint be directed?
- 3. <u>Ruth-Ann, ZSAP chair</u>- A meet sanction request is submitted by a club to the LSC and denied by LSC. The team wants to appeal the decision, where should it be directed?
- 4. <u>Nicki, LSC GC</u>- At an LSC meeting, someone challenges the direction of the LSC. Where is the appropriate place to address the concern?
- 5. <u>Jamie, Zone Director-</u> Two LSCs were assigned to attend a different Zone meet than they had anticipated. They had already made travel arrangements, etc. to attend the other meet in the Zone. They were in fact assigned to the other meet. Who should they go to for help with resolving the matter?
- 6. Derek, USA Swimming Staff-The head coach of large club, asks the parents and coaches to let him know about any families who are looking for a club to join. He is told by one family that they know of an athlete from their former club who is looking for a stronger training program. They pass along the athlete's cell phone number. The coach reaches out to the athlete. If the athlete, his parents or his current coach seeks to bring a complaint, Where should it be filed?
- 7. <u>Derek, USA Swimming staff</u>- A coach member attends a meet drunk or high on drugs and you have evidence of this intoxication. Where should you report the incident?
- 8. Paul, LSC/Zone Safe Sport-Two male swimmers are accused by a female swimmer on another team of sending inappropriate text messages of a sexual and threatening nature. All athletes are minors; the coaches of both teams are working with all parties involved. The female reported to the Center for SafeSport and an investigation is underway, but no ruling has been made. Police have taken reports and investigated but taken no other action in either case. The coaches have alerted the LSC that in both cases, the parents have mentioned legal action if the boys are

- not allowed to swim at the LSC championship meet. Where should the coaches report the alleged behavior of the male athletes?
- 9. <u>Nicki/Lynne- LSC BOD/ARB</u>- Bad behavior between parents happens in the stands of a meet. Police are called, break up the fight and remove the parents from the meet. It is reported to the LSC BOD. The BOD suspends the parents from attending future championship meets for 1 year. The parents want to appeal the decision of the BOD. Where can they file an appeal?
- 10. <u>Derek, USA Swimming Staff</u>- A father (who is also a member of USA Swimming) punches an official at a meet because they made a call against his son that he disagrees with.
- 11. Lynne, LSC ARB Chair-The LSC BOD revises the fee structure for fines and penalties in the P&P. A club violates the provisions of both the P&P and the Meet Announcement during a meet. The club is fined by the BOD. The Club challenges the fine, alleging that they are egregious and refuses to pay them. Could the club file a complaint? What would be the appropriate venue?
- 12. <u>Nicki, LSC GC-</u> A team in the LSC is "known" for stealing swimmers from another team. So much alleged recruiting has gone on that both teams now refuse to allow the others to attend their regular in-season meets. Where should this issue be addressed? What are the options if either of the teams don't agree with the decision?
- 13. <u>Paul, Zone/LSC Safe Sport/ Center for SafeSport/ Law Enforcment-</u> An incident occurs at a Zone meet between minor athletes. It is sexual in nature. Where should this incident be reported and who is responsible for reporting it?
- 14. <u>Lynne, LSC ARB-</u> 2 clubs bid for the same LSC meet; one club is awarded the meet according to LSC procedures. During the HOD, the losing club brings forth a proposal to rescind the original bid winner and make a motion to move the meet to a different location, and it passes. Is this appropriate? Where should the original team file an appeal of the decision?
- 15. <u>Derek, USA Swimming/rules chair/ NBOR</u>- A parent, who is timing at a meet is removed from the deck after repeatedly using a cell phone behind the blocks to film her daughter during her races. The Meet Referee activated the Meet Jury who ruled on the situation. The parent wants to protest the removal so she can remain on deck for the next days events. Who should she call to file her protest?

16. <u>Nicki, LSC GC</u>- An LSC denies travel reimbursement of athletes from a team as it didn't adhere to established LSC policies for reimbursement. The LSC denies the reimbursement request, the LSC doesn't have an ARB. What other options are available to the team to appeal the decision of the BOD?
